
## Professor John Haldane

The University of Notre Dame Australia presents one of the world's foremost Catholic philosophers and a significant public intellectual, Professor John Haldane, who has been appointed to a Visiting Professorship. Professor Haldane will teach a unit in Semester One 2016 within the School of Philosophy & Theology.

This unit, entitled *The Good Society, its Nature and Foundations*, explores the relatively recent movement away from a common philosophical and religious consensus inherited from Greco-Roman and Judeo-Christian traditions, to examine different responses to the challenges facing contemporary societies. It will discuss the ideas of ancient, modern and contemporary thinkers to consider what we might reasonably hope for in the way of a substantial philosophy of personal and social morality.

Students, academics and the public are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity to study with Professor Haldane. He holds professorships at Universities in the UK and USA, codirects the Centre for Ethics, Philosophy and Public Affairs (University of St Andrews); Research Fellow of the Center for Ethics and Culture, (University of Notre Dame, USA), and Chair of the Royal Institute of Philosophy, London.
