

Share the Dream echoes the call of the late Pope John Paul II to families – to become what you are – the communities of life and love which make the presence of our Lord real to those around us.


God himself affirmed the importance of the family. Born into a human family, Jesus lived the greater proportion of his life among us following the universal path from childhood into the daily

Bishop Jean Laffitte
Pontifical Council
for the Family

Having served as the undersecretary of the Pontifical Council for the Family (PCF) and as the

Vice-President of the Pontifical Academy for Life, in 2009 Bishop Jean Laffitte was appointed Secretary of the PCF. Bishop Laffitte holds a Doctorate in Moral Theology and has made significant contributions to marriage and family issues over a number of years. How to get there

Xavier College, Senior Campus

Barkers Rd, Kew, Melbourne.


Public Transport - From the City & East Melbourne ■ From the CBD or East Melbourne, take tram route 109 or 42 which travel from Collins St, through East Melbourne via Victoria Parade and Victoria St, through Richmond to Kew. From stop 35 (Corner Cotham Rd & Charles St) it is a 5 minute walk to the north (rear) entrance of Xavier College.

From Other Part of Melbourne ■ If you are travelling by train from other parts of Melbourne, the nearest railway station is Glenferrie. Take the 16 tram north along Glenferrie Road to stop 77. It is a 5 minute walk down College Place and Hanson St to the east (side) entrance of Xavier College.

Parking ■ Xavier College has parking for approximately 250 cars. The main Xavier College entrance is from Barkers Road. There is no access to the Xavier College car park by the rear entrance. Additional parking is also available in the VicRoads car park next to Xavier College. Entrance to the VicRoads car park is via Denmark St. There is a footpath linking VicRoads to Xavier College.

Weather in April

Mid-autumn is arguably the most pleasant time of year to visit Melbourne. The average minimum temperature is 12°C and the average maximum is 21°C. Nights can be a bit cooler dropping below 10°C. It is generally the least windy time of year with average wind speed of 9km per hour being the lowest of any month. Being Melbourne, however, we suggest preparing for the unpredictable.



1 Saturday morning workshops

1.1 Fr Anthony Percy

Fr Percy is Rector of the Good Shepherd Seminary in Sydney. After undertaking post-graduate study at the John Paul II Institute for Marriage & Family in Washington, he completed a Doctorate in Sacred Theology. He is author of *Theology of the Body Made Simple*.

Sexual Sense in a World of Senseless Sex

Using Pope John Paul II's Theology of the Body, this workshop will illustrate how in the innate language of acceptance and offering, the human body proclaims the beauty of sexuality and how the late Pope's teaching meets the grave difficulties we currently face in our over sexualised world.

1.4 Anna Krohn

Anna is widely regarded for her teaching and writing in ethics and theology. She is completing a PhD at the John Paul II Institute for Marriage & Family on Dietrich von Hildebrand's "philosophy of the heart".

Romance & Rationality

What should rule - our head or our heart? In reflecting on marriage, family and love generally, some believe that the mind or the will are the key to love, decision making and enduring commitment. This workshop will explore why philosopher, Dietrich von Hildebrand insisted that our affectivity and feelings also have a vital role to play.

1.2 Bishop Peter Elliott

Bishop Elliott is Auxiliary Bishop for the Southern Region of Melbourne. He holds a Doctorate in Sacred Theology from the John Paul II Institute for Marriage & Family in Rome and is Director of the Melbourne Session of the Institute.

Familiaris Consortio - 30 Years On

The Papal Exhortation of Pope John Paul II on *The Christian Family in the Modern World* has been described as the "Magna Carta of the Family". Given the dramatic social changes of the past 30 years, does its vision and teaching remain relevant to the mission of the family today?

1.5 Bernadette Black

Pregnant at 16, Bernadette later founded the Brave Foundation, to support women in similar situations. Author, happily married mother of three, and sought-after presenter, Bernadette was named 2009 Australian Mother of the Year.

Teen Pregnancy & Challenging Choices

Beginning with her own story, Bernadette highlights the power of our choices, the importance of values and of being proactive rather than reactive. This workshop will be as inspiring as it is practical in offering ways to help young people make life affirming choices in difficult times.

1.3 Deacon Anthony Gooley

Deacon Anthony leads the *Focus on Welcome and Inclusion* project in the Brisbane Archdiocese. Within the team, he has a special focus on inclusion of people with disability in parish life.

Creating Inclusive Parish Communities

Raising disability awareness and developing the confidence and capacity of parish communities to know and welcome people with disabilities can be a difficult task. This workshop will explore some strategies to address this issue and develop the existing social capital of parishes and dioceses.

1.6 Marcia Riordan

Marcia is an Executive Officer of the Life, Marriage and Family Office Melbourne. Since 2000, Marcia has been spreading a positive message about life issues. She has a Master's in Bioethics from the John Paul II Institute for Marriage & Family.

Culture & Coercion - Population Control & the Family

Powerful forces around the world are trying to tie climate change to population growth. Are we facing a population explosion or a decline? What happens when a one-child policy is imposed on families? How might Catholic families inspire a profound cultural renewal and a new human ecology?



1.7 David Schütz / Denise Lacey

David is Executive Officer of the Melbourne Archdiocese's Ecumenical and Interfaith Commission. Denise is the Manager of Marriage & Relationship Education for Centacare Catholic Family Services Melbourne.

Interfaith Marriages

Do interfaith marriages work? How can couples navigate their unique challenges with integrity and respect? In this session, couples in interfaith marriages join David and Denise to explore the blessings, difficulties, strengths and challenges that arise and how they maintain a healthy marriage.

1.8 Dr Fran McNerney & Sherry-Ann Bailey

Fran is the Associate Professor of Aged Care, a joint appointment between ACU School of Nursing & Midwifery and Catholic Homes. Sherry-Ann is the General Manager, Community Services, Catholic Homes.

Family & Caring for the Aged

This seminar looks at the role that families play in supporting care for the aged whilst preserving dignity and independence. How can and does the teaching of the Church reflect in the way we serve the elderly? What are the practical implications for families?

1.9 Fr Tony Kerin EV

Fr Tony Kerin is an Associate Judicial Vicar of the Tribunal of the Catholic Church, President of the Canon Law Society of Australia & New Zealand, Episcopal Vicar for Justice & Social Service for the Archdiocese of Melbourne and a parish priest.

The Mysteries of the Marriage Tribunal

In a world where few of our families are not in some way touched by separation or divorce, this session will address some common questions and misconceptions about divorce, annulment and marriage in the Catholic Church.

1.10 John Duiker

John is a coordinator of Catholic Charismatic Renewal in Melbourne. He is a singer/song writer, the father of five children and is currently completing a Doctorate in Theology.

The Creative Catholic Home

It can seem tough these days to pray, to be holy and to tell people about Jesus, but fear not; it is possible. This workshop will explore creative and practical approaches to family spiritual life through prayer, music, movies and books, as well as suggesting ways to make the liturgy come alive at home!

1.11 Pam & Trevor Atkinson

Pam & Trevor came to Australia as a Neocatechumenal Mission Family in 1990. Commissioned by Pope John Paul II, they are based in Coburg and work in a number of parishes throughout the Melbourne Archdiocese.

Passing on the Faith Through the Family

Finding practical ways to build faith into the ordinary practices of daily life can be a challenge. The "Three Altars" promoted in the Neocatechumenal Way has been recognised for its uniqueness and fruitfulness in enhancing the value and role of the family in the modern world.

1.12 Panel Chaired by Fr Delmar Silva CS EV

Couples from different cultural backgrounds will join Fr Delmar, an Episcopal Vicar for Migrants & Refugees, to share their experiences of family life and culture in the Australian Church.

To Give and to Receive - Migrant Families & the Church

Each new wave of migration to Australia brings families who breathe a new and often distinctive life into our Catholic community. This workshop will consider ways in which we can give practical support to newly arrived families as well as how they enrich and serve our Church.

2 ^{saturday} **afternoon** workshops

2.1 Bishop Anthony Fisher OP

Anthony Fisher is Bishop of the Parramatta Diocese. Internationally recognised as a writer and teacher on family and life issues, he was the founding Director of the John Paul II Institute for Marriage & Family in Melbourne.

Art, Evangelisation & the Christian Family

What does beauty have to do with evangelisation? How can the family use art to enhance its faith? This seminar will consider these questions in light of the mission of the Christian family in the modern world.

2.4 Derek Boylan

Derek is the Director of Catholic Marriage Education Services in the Perth Archdiocese and Chair of the Catholic Society of Marriage Educators. He and his wife Karen have six children.

Mentoring & Serving in Marriage

The great Christian paradox – that it is more blessed to give than to receive – is as true of marriage as any human relationship. This session will explore how mentoring younger couples, especially those preparing for marriage and newlyweds, can deepen and strengthen your own relationship.

2.2 Jonathan E Doyle

Jonathan Doyle is the director of Choicez Media, Australia's largest provider of values-based sexuality education programs. On an average day over 10,000 Australian students access one of Choicez Media's wide range of programs.

The Problem with Pornography – What Parents Need to Know

The massive growth of pornography is a global phenomenon that leaves many parents feeling overwhelmed. This dynamic seminar will give every parent powerful insights into the latest research, explore trends and effects of pornography, giving hope for the future and practical tips for real change.

2.5 Clara Geoghegan

Clara works for the Archbishop's Office for Evangelisation in the Melbourne Archdiocese as the Called & Gifted Coordinator. She is the Convener of Friends of Caroline Chisholm and lectures at Catholic Theological College & ACU.

Ordinary Families – Extraordinary Mission

Caroline Chisholm was an outstanding pioneer in colonial Australia but she could not have fulfilled this work without the support of her husband. From the beginning, the consistent theme of their work was to assist families in living out their vocation. Can their marriage be seen as a model for collaboration in mission?

2.3 Dr Gerard O'Shea

Gerard is Principal of St Patrick's Primary School Mentone and a sessional lecturer at the John Paul II Institute of Marriage & Family. He and his wife, Anne, are past presidents of the National Association of Catholic Families and have five children.

The Home & Education in Sexual Dignity

This session offers strategies for parents on how to help children develop a healthy understanding of sexuality and dignity through an individual dialogue within the home. Using the resource *As I Have Loved You*, Gerard will help parents develop greater confidence in being the primary educators of their children.

2.6 Rob Ward & Pat Byrne

Rob is the Victorian, South Australian & Tasmanian State Director for the Australian Christian Lobby. Pat Byrne is the Vice President of the National Civic Council.

The Family & The Public Square

Amongst all the voices speaking into framing public policy as it affects families, how can we ensure our Christian voice is heard? What positive steps can you take to give voice to your values in public policy debate?



2.7 Cameron Cutts

Cameron lives and works in a L'Arche household. L'Arche is an international federation of faith communities founded by Jean Vanier. It is centered on sharing life with people with an intellectual disability.

The Life of Love & Disability

This workshop will explore "hands on" ways in which families can experience the gift of people with an intellectual disability. Through story telling and song, our presenters will share about life in L'Arche, and offer some helpful tips in how to build these unique relationships.

2.8 Kathleen West

Kathleen left a successful career in banking and has spent the past 16 years working largely in adoption and foster care services. She is Manager of Family Support and Out of Home Care for Centacare Catholic Family Services.

Out of Home Care & Finding Love

Children in need of care outside of their natural family are among those most in need of our love. This workshop considers responding to this need as an important witness of Christian love and how it enriches not just the children, but the families who open their homes as well.

2.9 Julie & Matthew MacDonald

Matthew is an Executive Officer of the Life, Marriage and Family Office, Melbourne. Matthew has a Grad Dip in Theology from the John Paul II Institute for Marriage & Family. He and Julie have five children.

The Gospel & the Kitchen Table

While the Apostles preached in the early Church, Christian families gave a decisive witness which changed history. This session deals with practical ways for families to give the witness of love that will draw the hearts of our neighbours and friends toward Christ.

2.10 Panel Chaired by Alan & Marie Mason

Alan & Marie are the Coordinators of Courage and Encourage Melbourne. This panel will include a psychologist, priest and others who have lived with same sex attraction while striving to remain faithful to the Gospel.

Love, Truth, & Same Sex Attraction

This interactive workshop will consider how we respond with compassion, love and truth to those friends and members of our families who struggle with same sex attraction. It will provide pastoral and clinical perspectives along with the reflections of those who have lived the experience.

2.11 Panel Chaired by Mary-Jane Stolp

Mary-Jane Stolp, Quality and Risk Manager of Catholic Homes will be joined by Dr Fran McInerney & Sherry Ann Baily to share their combined knowledge of the aged care sector and how it can support families.

Practical Support for the Aged & the Family

Ageing brings many challenges and opportunities. This interactive workshop follows *Session 1.8*. It will provide an overview of integrated services for the aged as well as looking at how and where families can find practical assistance and support the changing needs of their loved ones.

2.12 Panel Chaired by Fr Dom Murphy OP

Fr Dominic, Vocations Director of the Dominican Community will be joined by Fr Binh Le, Vocations Director, Melbourne Archdiocese, Sr Rachel Fleurant (MGL) and a representative from Mother Teresa's Missionaries of Charity.

Fostering Vocations in the Family

What sort of signs might indicate a call to religious life? How can parents help young people discern that call? Through sharing their own experiences, our panel will help families to recognise the signs and how they can help to nurture and discern that call with their children.

3rd Sunday morning workshops

3.1 A/Prof Tracey Rowland

Tracey is an internationally recognised author and teacher. She is Dean of the John Paul II Institute for Marriage & Family and a Permanent Fellow of the Institute in Political Philosophy and Continental Theology.

Canonised Couples

A remarkable feature of the pontificate of John Paul II was the number of saints canonised and among them, married men and women. This session will help couples to draw inspiration from the example of those whose fidelity to both Christ and their spouse, stands as a model of Christian life.

3.4 A/Prof Nicholas Tonti-Filippini

Nick is the Associate Dean and Head of Bioethics at the John Paul II Institute for Marriage & Family. He writes and advises extensively on Bioethics. He is married to Dr Mary Walsh and they have four children.

Testing Times for Parents

Becoming pregnant is normally a time of joy but increasingly women are waiting until medical tests rule out abnormalities before welcoming the news. We discuss the pressures that women now face, coping with news of abnormality, grief, and the need for support for mothers, their husbands and older children.

3.2 Andrew Mullins / Pat & Maureen Coyne

Andrew is the Principal of Redfield College, Sydney and author of *Parenting for Character*. Pat and Maureen have six children and 11 grandchildren. They have facilitated parenting courses and marriage enrichment for the past 10 years.

Parenting for Character

Raising our children to become mature and happy adults presents one of the most rewarding yet challenging aspects of married and family life. This workshop considers how parents can most effectively nurture in their children, the virtues that will equip them to meet the challenges that life inevitably presents.

3.5 Warwick Marsh

Warwick and his wife Alison founded the Dads4Kids Fatherhood Foundation in 2002. Dads4Kids inspires men to seek excellence as husbands and fathers using a variety of media and educational tools.

7 Secrets to Success as a Father

This session is for those who are keen to embark on the journey of fathering excellence. Warwick will give seven keys to help Dads be the best they can be for their wives and for their children.

3.3 Kevin & Margaret Andrews

Kevin and Margaret have been actively involved in marriage education since 1980. Margaret is the editor of marriage education magazine, *Threshold*. Kevin chaired the national inquiry on strategies to strengthen marriage and relationships.

Family & the Future

Family dynamics are changing rapidly in the western world. This workshop will examine the latest trends. What are the changes that threaten the family and where do we see signs of hope? What can we expect to see in the future and how can we influence that now?

3.6 Glenn & Trish Mowbray

Glenn and Trish have been worked in the disability field for 25 years and have four adult children. Trish is a Disability Projects Officer for the Australian Catholic Bishops' Commission for Pastoral Life.

Faith & Light - Families & Disability

Each of us has a mission to nurture the unique gifts and beauty of every person. How do each of us play a role in this? Whether we are parents, friends or people living with an intellectual disability, how do we bring faith and light to the world?

3.7 Mary Tobin & Bronwyn Egan

Mary is the Manager of the Student Wellbeing Unit at the Catholic Education Office, Melbourne. Bronwyn is an Education Officer in the Student Wellbeing Unit and manages the cyber safety portfolio.

Responding to Cyber Bullying - A Parent's Guide

This workshop will explore how parents, schools and students can work in partnership to become responsible digital citizens. It will show what schools are able to do and suggest ways that parents can support their children.

3.8 Paula Sharp

Paula, a *Seasons* Grief & Loss Education Officer, has worked for 11 years supporting community education and the development of *Seasons* groups in schools, parishes and community settings.

Responding to Separation & Divorce

Many people experience grief through separation and divorce. *Seasons* is a process of journeying with individuals and the group as they engage in an exploration of what happens when they grieve. This workshop will explore ways for parishes to help those grieving in their community.

3.9 Prof Ron & Mavis Pirola

Ron and Mavis Pirola chair the Australian Catholic Marriage and Family Council and have been representatives on the Pontifical Council for the Family. They have extensive experience with parish initiatives in marriage and family ministry.

Parish Family Ministry - Making it Happen!

This workshop will focus on parish initiatives that develop and empower couples and their families to be agents of evangelisation. It will explore the practical application of Pope Benedict XVI's call for the laity to be "co-responsible" for the "being and action of the Church".

3.10 Helen & Leo Wursthorn

Helen and Leo have led Marriage Encounter in Victoria for the past 16 years. They have five adult children and have been married for 32 years.

Difficult Conversations & What Matters Most

Communicating effectively in marriage is essential to a harmonious family life. But how do we overcome the fear of beginning those difficult conversations that we know we need to have? This workshop considers how we can work through this tension and build the intimacy that underpins our relationships.

3.11 Mark & Ursula Boyd

Mark is a business executive and Ursula, a teacher. Living in Central Queensland and raising seven children from primary age to adults, they bring a rich experience to the uniquely challenging setting of rural family ministry.

Family Ministry in Rural Australia

Families are nurtured through the witness and support of other families in their community. How can families in rural areas share this experience? This workshop will challenge our ideas on nurturing family life in isolated and rural communities.

3.12 James & Sarah McDonald

James is Director of Catholic Adult Education, Sydney. He and Sarah have been involved in marriage and family ministry for the past 10 years. With their four children they spend six years living in a communal household.

Community & Household

Many people have sought to combine the Church's rich tradition of religious communal living with Christian family life. This workshop offers practical insights into opening or extending family life - its blessings and its challenges.
