## **RELICS OF POPULAR SAINTS TOUR SYDNEY**

Thousands of Catholics across Sydney are expected at ceremonies across the city and suburbs from this weekend to revere the relics of Therese of Lisieux and her parents, Louis and Zelie Martin who are also saints.

Affectionately known as "the Little Flower", the French-born St Therese is one of the most popular saints in the history of the Catholic Church, revered for her simple message to the faithful that they can serve God through simple acts of kindness.

The relics of St Therese, St Louis and St Zelie will be officially welcomed at a ceremony at St Mary's Cathedral on **Saturday 1 February at 4:30pm**. The faithful will be able to venerate the relics during an all-night vigil before they begin a tour across the Archdiocese of Sydney in February and March as part of a broader national pilgrimage.

The Archbishop of Sydney, Most Rev. Anthony Fisher OP said it was an historic occasion, with the last relics tour of St Therese attracting crowds of nearly half a million Australians in 2002, including more than 4000 at St Mary's Cathedral.

"There is a long tradition in the Catholic Church of the faithful to venerate the relic of saints with religious pilgrimages to honour their memory," Archbishop Fisher said.

"St Therese reminds us that you don't have to be spectacular to be a saint through her call to serve God in simple ways which could involve confronting our personal vices or putting up with irritations or being misunderstood and offering these as flowers to God."

The relics will depart St Mary's Cathedral on Sunday 2 February at 4pm before embarking on their national tour. A full itinerary for the relics tour is available via this link: <u>http://bit.ly/2RxwUdm</u>
