Step 5: Evaluation

Step 5 of the risk assessment involves evaluating the strategies you used to mitigate each of the risks after the activity. Did you successfully mitigate the risks? Is there more you could do to create a safer environment next time? Update your plan and identify improvements that should be made. See the below examples for guidance.
