National Catholic Safeguarding Standards

Indicator 5.7.1 of the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards requires Church entities to implement a system to assess the safeguarding credentials and manage the movement of all seminarians, clergy and religious moving between different seminaries, formation programs and Church jurisdictions. This includes dual declarations made by both the individual and the relevant Church Authority that verify that the individual coming to exercise ministry in a new jurisdiction is currently in good standing, and records the movement and activities of those individuals.

'Good standing' means:

- there are not currently any complaints of abuse against an individual;
- there have never been any substantiated complaints of abuse against an individual;
- there are no known circumstances that could lead to a complaint of abuse against an individual; and
- an individual is not otherwise deemed to be an unacceptable risk to children, young people or adults at risk.
