Avenues for Feedback

The Direct Personal Response (DPR) is an opportunity for the Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney (the Archdiocese) to demonstrate its accountability to Survivors. The Archdiocese is committed to providing a trauma informed and Survivor focussed approach to the DPR process. It is important to allow all relevant parties an avenue for honest feedback which will help us to ensure the process continues to be an effective and positive experience for the Survivor and for any concerns to be addressed.

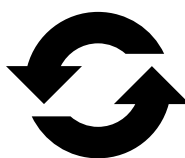
Follow up after the DPR will involve:

Actions



→ **Checking in/debrief** will be done by the DPR Facilitator from the Archdiocese. It will be informal and completed directly after the DPR and then again 3-5 days after the DPR. The Facilitator will debrief and provide support and respond to any questions



→ **Avenues for providing feedback** to the Archdiocese on the DPR process include;

- Speaking with the Facilitator when he/she checks in with you immediately after the DPR and/or when contact is made 3-5 days after the DPR;
- Anonymous: you can provide feedback anonymously if you wish.
